











NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. Exhibitors should also ***read the Rules*** at the back of the Schedule.
2. All classes are open to all persons unless otherwise stated. Exhibitors are not required to be a member of the Society.
3. An exhibitor may submit any number of entries in any number of classes.
4. Entries may be submitted as follows:
 - a) Emailed to showentries@fchs.org.au prior to 10:00am Thursday 1st September, or
 - b) Phoned to the Entries Team (03) 8719 6924 Wednesday 31st August 6:00pm - 10:00pm, or
 - c) Phoned to the Entries Team (03) 8719 6924 Thursday 1st September 9:00am - 10:00am, or
 - d) Written entries in the Entries Box at the Society's hall Thursday 1st September 8:30am - 10:00am
5. When submitting entries, exhibitors need only provide the Entry Secretary with the Class number. The Section letter is not required. It is advisable to make a list of your entries so that you can check them as they are read back to you.
6. Note that some classes require the size of the exhibit and/or the container to be nominated at the time of entering.
7. Entries close at 10:00am Thursday 1st September. Late entries may be accepted at the absolute discretion of the Show Manager.
8. Entries are to be staged in the Society's hall:
 - a) Friday 2nd September 1:00pm - 8:00pm, or
 - b) Saturday 3rd September 8:00am - 10:00am
9. Judging commences at 10:30am Saturday 3rd September.

SECTION A - DAFFODILS

Royal Horticultural Society - System of Classification

All daffodils are classified into one of thirteen divisions. Each daffodil cultivar or garden hybrid belongs to one of the first twelve divisions. Those species distinguished solely by botanical name belong in Division 13. Below are the definitions for each Division:

<p>Division 1: Trumpet</p>  <p>One flower per stem, corona (trumpet) at least as long as the perianth segments (petals)</p>	<p>Division 8: Tazetta</p>  <p>3 to 20 flowers per stem, perianth segments spreading (not reflexed) and usually fragrant</p>
<p>Division 2: Large Cupped</p>  <p>One flower per stem, corona (cup) more than 1/3 but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments</p>	<p>Division 9: Poeticus</p>  <p>Usually one flower per stem, perianth segments white, corona very short or disc-shaped, usually with a green/yellow centre and red rim, but sometimes of a single colour</p>
<p>Division 3: Small Cupped</p>  <p>One flower per stem, corona (cup) not more than 1/3 of the length of the perianth segments</p>	<p>Division 10: Bulbocodium</p>  <p>Usually one flower per stem, perianth segments insignificant compared to the corona, anthers dorsifixed (attached central to filament), filament style curved</p>
<p>Division 4: Double</p>  <p>One or more flowers per stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona, or both</p>	<p>Division 11: Split Corona</p>  <p>Corona (cup or trumpet) is split, usually for more than 1/2 its length, Type a - Collar The corona segments are opposite the perianth segments, corona segments usually in two whorls of three Type b - Papillon corona segments alternate to the perianth segments, usually in a single whorl of six</p>
<p>Division 5: Triandrus</p>  <p>Usually two or more pendant flowers per stem, perianth segments often reflexed</p>	
<p>Division 6: Cyclamineus</p>  <p>One flower per stem, perianth segments prominently reflexed, flower at an acute angle to the stem with a very short pedicel (neck)</p>	<p>Division 12: Other Cultivars</p> <p>Cultivars which do not fit the other classifications</p>
<p>Division 7: Jonquilla & Apodanthus</p>  <p>Usually 1 to 5 (more rarely up to 8) flowers per stem, perianth segments reflexed or spreading, corona is cup or funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long</p>	<p>Division 13: Species</p>  <p>All species and wild or reputedly wild variants and hybrids distinguished solely by botanical name</p>

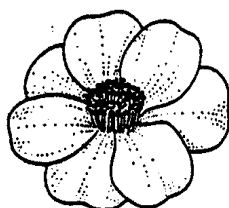

Classifications of Camellias

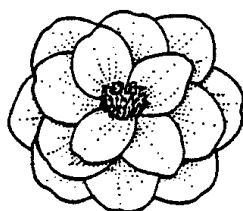
Forms and descriptions of Japonica blooms



Single

A flower having a maximum of 8 petals in a single row, with an unbroken cluster of stamens.

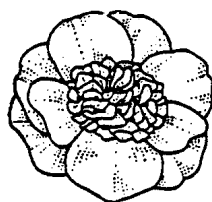
Note : Not more than eight petals.



Semi-Double

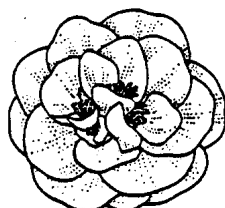
A flower having either of two forms as follows:

- a) Two or more rows of petals, with an unbroken cluster of stamens.
- b) Irregular Semi-Double, may have one or more petaloids within the cluster of stamens.



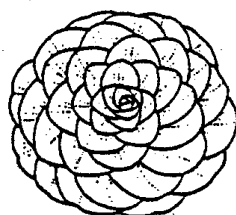
Elegans Form (previously Anemone Form)

A flower with one or more rows of large outer petals lying flat or undulating; with a distinct centre of intermingled petaloids and stamens.



Informal Double (previously Peony Form)

A flower having any number of petals and petaloids. Stamens may or may not be visible. The flower may range from loosely arranged petals divided by stamens to a full double with a mass of petals and petaloids with no stamens showing.



Formal Double

A flower having any number of petals regularly placed, with no visible stamens, and preferably with a bud centre.

HYBRID AND RETICULATA blooms are divided by size according to the schedule.

Section B - Camellias (continued)**NOTES**

BLOOM SIZES: These should always be within the guidelines set when the cultivar was first registered, if known, in order to preclude undersized blooms being shown as Miniatures.

Miniature: Diameter not to exceed 70 mm
Small: Diameter over 70 mm, but not exceeding 90 mm
Medium: Diameter over 90 mm, but not exceeding 100 mm
Large: Diameter over 100 mm, but not exceeding 130 mm
Very Large: Diameter over 130 mm

HYBRID: Any Camellia that is generally accepted as a cross, including two or more species of Camellias, e.g. 'Debbie', 'Lasca Beauty'.

CLUSTER OR SPRAY: One stem of Miniature flowered species or Hybrid. Several blooms and buds may be included on the stem, e.g. *lutchuensis* 'Snowdrop'.

SPECIES: The genus *Camellia* is divided into more than 200 related groups which are known as species, e.g. *Camellia salicifolia*, *Camellia lutchuensis*.

These Rules are in accordance with those of the Australian Horticultural Judges' Association Inc.

1. any exhibit not in accordance with the Schedule must be disqualified and marked N.A.S. by the Judge.
2. Exhibitors must use containers supplied by the Society unless otherwise stated, or unless prior arrangements have been made with the Show Manager and no advantage is gained by the use of such container.
3. All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor and shall have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least three (3) months prior to this Show.
4. All exhibits of cut flowers become the property of the Show Committee (unless the Secretary is notified by the exhibitor to the contrary) and may be sold or destroyed at the close of the Show.
5. Exhibits in other classes shall be considered the property of the Show Committee until the close of the Show and must not be removed without the permission of the stewards.
6. Should any exhibit not be considered worthy of the prize allotted in the Schedule, the Judge shall have power to reduce the value of such prize or withhold same.
7. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
8. EXHIBITORS IN ALL CLASSES ARE REQUESTED TO NAME EXHIBITS ON THEIR ENTRY CARDS. This rule will be taken into consideration in cases of close competition. Entrants wishing to have an entry named should leave a card with **Name Please** on it.
9. Abbreviations: C.V.A. Colour Variation Allowed
N.N.D. Not Necessarily Distinct
S.S. Staged Singly
10. Flowering Shrubs includes Trees and Climbers.
11. Own foliage permitted in all exhibits.
12. Wiring of flowers prohibited.
13. A container holds any number of stems.
14. A vase consists of not fewer than three stems and not more than six.
15. **Novice.** Open only to those who have not won a first prize or a Blue Ribbon in that section at any Horticultural Show.
16. All exhibits, except where otherwise stated, must not exceed 75 cm in width and height above the bench.
17. Self watering pots and hanging baskets may be used.
