IN ALL CASES THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES SHALL BE
CONSIDERED FINAL**

These Rules are in accordance with those of the Australian Horticultural Judges' Association Inc.

1. Any exhibit not in accordance with the Schedule will be disqualified and marked N.A.S. by the Judge.
2. Exhibitors must use containers supplied by the Society unless otherwise stated or prior arrangements have been made with the Show Manager. No advantage can be gained by using a non-Society container.
3. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor and have been in their possession for at least three months prior to the Show.
4. Cut flower exhibits become the property of the Society (unless otherwise arranged with the Show Manager by the exhibitor) and may be sold or destroyed after the Show.
5. Exhibits in other classes are considered the property of the Society until the Show's close and must not be removed without the permission of the Show Manager.
6. Exhibits considered by the Judge to be not worthy of the prize allotted in the Schedule shall have the prize withheld or reduced in value.
7. The Show Manager reserves the right to refuse any entry.
8. EXHIBITORS ARE REQUESTED TO NAME EXHIBITS ON THEIR ENTRY CARDS. This will be taken into consideration in cases of close competition. Entrants wishing to have an entry named should leave a card with Name Please on it.
9. Abbreviations: C.V.A. Colour Variation Allowed
N.N.D. Not Necessarily Distinct
S.S. Staged Singly
10. Flowering Shrubs include Trees and Climbers.
11. Own foliage is permitted in all exhibits.
12. Wiring of flowers is prohibited.
13. A container holds any number of stems.
14. A vase consists of at least three stems and not more than six.
15. **Novice Classes.** Open only to those who have not won a first prize or Blue Ribbon in that section at any Horticultural Show, or FCHS Novice awards in three or more FCHS shows. There will be a Best Novice in Show award across all classes designated as included for the Award.
16. Exhibits must not exceed these dimensions:
 - a. Pot: The area of a pot must not exceed 1,250 square centimetres at its widest point, eg 40cm diameter or 25cm x 50cm etc
 - b. Overall exhibit: 75 cm in width and height above the bench unless otherwise stated.
17. Self-watering pots and hanging baskets may be used.

1. Read the Rules at the back of the Schedule and the Notes applying to each Section.
2. All classes are open to everyone unless stated otherwise. Membership of the Society is not required to enter the Show.
3. Exhibitors may submit any number of entries in any number of classes.
4. Entries close at 10:00am Thursday 3rd September. Late entries may be accepted at the Show Manager's discretion.
5. Entries can be submitted as follows:
 - a) By email to showentries@fchs.org.au before 10:00am Thursday 3rd September, or
 - b) By phone to 0455 531 911
Wednesday 2nd September 7:30pm - 8:30pm; or
Thursday 3rd September 9:00am - 10:00am; or
 - c) In writing in the Entries Box at the Society's hall
Thursday 3rd September 8:30am - 10:00am.
6. Only the Class number is required when submitting entries. The section letter is not required. If entering by phone, make a list of your entries before calling so you can check them as they are read back to you.
7. Some classes require the size of the exhibit and/or container to be specified at the time of entry.
8. Entries are to be staged in the Society's hall:
 - a) Friday 4th September 1:00pm - 9:00pm; or
 - b) Saturday 5th September 7:00am - 10:00am.
9. **NEW EXHIBITORS:** Feel free to ask a Steward or other experienced Society members for help and advice when staging exhibits. First time exhibitors should mark their bench cards with "N" in red.
10. Judging starts at 10:15am Saturday 5th September.
11. Exhibitors must maintain their exhibits for the duration of the Show (until 4:00pm Sunday 6th September).

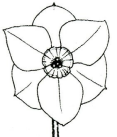

SECTION A - DAFFODILS

Royal Horticultural Society - System of Classification

All daffodils are classified into one of thirteen divisions. Each daffodil cultivar or garden hybrid belongs to one of the first twelve divisions. Those species distinguished solely by botanical name belong in Division 13. Below are the definitions for each Division:

Division 1: Trumpet  One flower per stem, corona (trumpet) at least as long as the perianth segments (petals)	Division 8: Tazetta  3 to 20 flowers per stem, perianth segments spreading (not reflexed) and usually fragrant
Division 2: Large Cupped  One flower per stem, corona (cup) more than 1/3 but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments	Division 9: Poeticus  Usually one flower per stem, perianth segments white, corona very short or disc-shaped, usually with a green/yellow centre and red rim, but sometimes of a single colour
Division 3: Small Cupped  One flower per stem, corona (cup) not more than 1/3 of the length of the perianth segments	Division 10: Bulbocodium  Usually one flower per stem, perianth segments insignificant compared to the corona, anthers dorsifixed (attached central to filament), filament style curved
Division 4: Double  One or more flowers per stem, with doubling of the perianth segments or the corona, or both	Division 11: Split Corona  Corona (cup or trumpet) is split, usually for more than 1/2 its length, Type a - Collar The corona segments are opposite the perianth segments, corona segments usually in two whorls of three Type b - Papillon corona segments alternate to the perianth segments, usually in a single whorl of six
Division 5: Triandrus  Usually two or more pendant flowers per stem, perianth segments often reflexed	Division 12: Other Cultivars  Cultivars which do not fit the other classifications
Division 6: Cyclamineus  One flower per stem, perianth segments prominently reflexed, flower at an acute angle to the stem with a very short pedicel (neck)	
Division 7: Jonquilla & Apodanthus  Usually 1 to 5 (more rarely up to 8) flowers per stem, perianth segments reflexed or spreading, corona is cup or funnel-shaped or flared, usually wider than long	Division 13: Species  All species and wild or reputedly wild variants and hybrids distinguished solely by botanical name

1. No support of any kind is allowed above the neck of the container
 2. Daffodil foliage should be shown with Daffodils
 3. Class A2 may only entered by amateur entrants, ie. those who do not deal in Daffodils commercially.

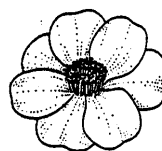

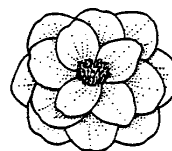
SECTION B - CAMELLIAS**Classifications of Camellias**

Forms and descriptions of Japonica blooms

**Single**

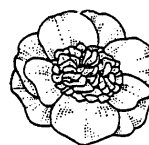
A flower having a maximum of 8 petals in a single row, with
an unbroken cluster of stamens.

Note : Not more than eight petals.

**Semi-Double**

A flower having either of two forms as follows:

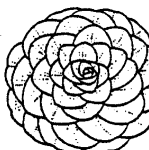
- Two or more rows of petals, with an unbroken cluster of stamens.
- Irregular Semi-Double, may have one or more petaloids within the cluster of stamens.

**Elegans Form (previously Anemone Form)**

A flower with one or more rows of large outer petals lying
flat or undulating; with a distinct centre of intermingled
petaloids and stamens.

**Informal Double (previously Peony Form)**

A flower having any number of petals and petaloids.
Stamens may or may not be visible. The flower may range
from loosely arranged petals divided by stamens to a full
double with a mass of petals and petaloids with no stamens
showing.

**Formal Double**

A flower having any number of petals regularly placed, with
no visible stamens, and preferably with a bud centre.

Hybrid and Reticulata

Blooms are divided by size according to the Schedule.

Section B - Camellias (continued)**NOTES**

BLOOM SIZES: These should always be within the guidelines set when the cultivar was first registered, if known, in order to preclude undersized blooms being shown as Miniatures.

- Miniature:** Diameter not to exceed 7 cm
Small: Diameter over 7 cm, but not exceeding 9 cm
Medium: Diameter over 9 cm, but not exceeding 10 cm
Large: Diameter over 10 cm, but not exceeding 13 cm
Very Large: Diameter over 13 cm

HYBRID: Any Camellia that is generally accepted as a cross, including two or more species of Camellias, e.g. 'Debbie', 'Lasca Beauty'.

CLUSTER OR SPRAY: One stem of Miniature flowered species or Hybrid. Several blooms and buds may be included on the stem, e.g. lutchuensis 'Snowdrop'.

SPECIES: The genus Camellia is divided into more than 200 related groups which are known as species, e.g. Camellia salicifolia, Camellia lutchuensis.
